On the notion of Councillor Manthata it was RESOLVED:

That the Urban Eartu Council agenda be suspended to enable the Council to discuss violence in Orlando West and Mendowlands.

HINREST IN SOMETO

Councillor Mosala Suggested that all the recommendations emanating from the Committees be adopted with the exception of the one on the future of Soweto Market and that a special meeting of the Urban Barriconnoil be called to consider the Frture of this Market.

He said that the Urban Bantu Council should march to Protea to require Senior Police Officers to maintain peace and order in Soweto by protecting the lives of the residents from the hostel inmates of the Marmhlophe and Duce Hostels.

Councillor Lengene said that people residing at Orlando West and Meadowlands allege that police were escorting hostel dwellers who were armed with dangerous weapons and who among other people, killed five people related to him.

We said if this position is left unchecked it might escalate into be city and that innocent people resident in the city and the Sowetc community working in town will be embroiled into this violence. In added that the Orlando West and Meadowlands zone 1 residents were evacuating their homes and sought refuge with relatives living in other townships.

Councillor Mionzi said that the Council should first examine the situation properly and decide on what action to take before marchi to Protea. He said none has not heard that hostel dwellers were in collusion with the police in that they were conveyed by police vehicles and dropped at strategid places where they started killiand injuring residents of Soweto. He moved:

(a) That all Momentands loaders be invited to a steelah, meeting of the Urban Mentu Gouldal are other growth a people of Soweto to be nold at 30 Albert Street and Homelands leaders would be briefed on the prestiling cituation in Soweto and thereafter they be requested to address their subjects resident in the various all infan attempt at rectoring peace in Soweto as a matter ungency, and

(b) That the air fares of the Homelands leaders be borne by the West Rand Administration Board.

Councillor G. Jiyane seconded the motion.

Councillor Mosala said that he endorsed Councillor Mionzi's views because the majority of hostel innates are migrant labourers who owe their allegiance to their various Homelands. He said hostel dwellors were armed to the nilt and are ready to attack the Sowto community. In conclusion he wanted to know what action the Council was going to take to bring violence to a halt as a matter of urgency. He felt that the idea of bringing Homelands leaders was a long term squarionity.

Councillor Lengene said that Homelands Governments have their own funds and should not be financed by the West Rand Administration Board when called upon to come and address their own people.

The Director Housing wanted to know to whom Homelands leaders would speak as there was a ban on public meetings and acced that if they did neet the Urban Bantu Council they would still not have reached the scople.

The Chairman said that Howelands leaders should in the first instance must the Urban Bantu Council members and thereafter they be requested to ackness their own subjects living in the hostels in the presence of the Urban Bantu Council members and other prominent residents of Soweto in an attempt at restoring peace.

RESCLVED:

That all Homelands leaders be invited to a special meeting of the Urban Bantu Council and other prominent people of Soweto to be held at 30 Albert Street where Homelands leaders will be briefed on the prevailing situation in Soweto and thereafter they be requested to address their subjects resident in the various hostels in an attempt at restoring peace in Soweto as a matter of urgency.
