

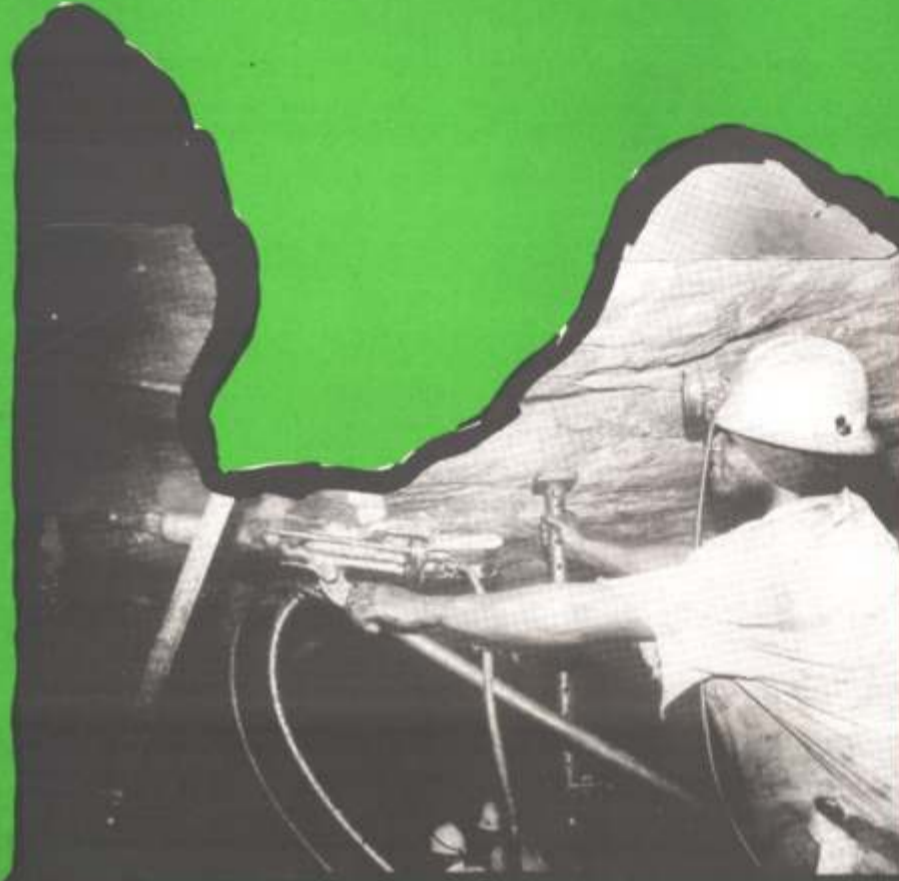

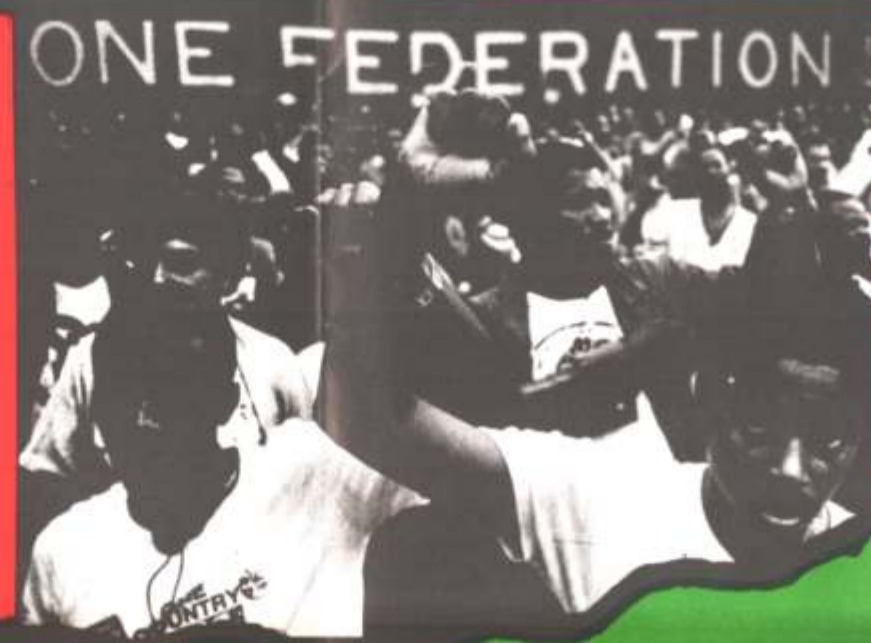
We are the workers of this land. We are the unemployed. We are the manual labourers.
