#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

- IN THE CHAIR: H.L. GAMDELA

The President reported about his recent rip to the Northern Cape where he was mandated by the Executivn to look into the feasibility of establishing an office there and to what extent the members there can shoulder its financial obligations.

He reported that he visited the major areas of Kimberley and Mafeking and just passed through Mlocofontain and tha Q.F.S. He noticed that contacts among the various student groups were inadequate. There were complaints and general disillusionment about SASO which they felt did not take adoquate interest in their flight.

C. 62 40 4242

He strongly recommended that an office would be most valcome in those areas to generate interest in SASO and to establish a centre of activity. There was a great deal of confidence that the project would pay for itself.

#### MEMORANDUM ON CONSTITUTION:-

Some explanations were required from the President as to where the areas of constitutional conflict between the President and the Secretary-General were to be found,

During debate several suggestions ere made

- that the matter be referred to and settled by the Executive and only " where this was not possible would it be referred to Executive Council and G.S.C.
- it was also mentioned that the issue had to be resolved seeing that it did come to the Executive Council.
- after a great doal of debate it was resolved that there was not much substance in the "misunderstanding" referred to in the President's Reflections. It was emphasised that working relations among the Executive be improved. If the President feels like pursuing the matter ha can call for a constitutional provision at G.S.C.

#### THE SONO CONTROVERSY:

Council noted that Some's expulsion at G.S.C. has caused a great deal of misunderstanding on the compus and also among those who have been following the developments in GASO with interest. His subsequent statements to the press were calculated to demong the image of GASO.

It was regretted that SASO Hoad Office does not soom to have done much to counter these allegations. It was suggested that although cars had to be taken not to oversatimate the extent of the concern among our people it was suggested that Head Office circulates on compuses and publish the text of SONO's speech and the debate which had to his expulsion. The Executive was also acked to deal with the situation as it deemed fit.

## 12/72:

Attangets are still being made to reach the Committee of the PUTCO Busdrivers. It has been reported that a trade union of markers in PUTCO was formed and the Dlack Workers' Project was asked to pursue the matter.

## 13/72:

In order to bring about an avarences of the dangers inherent in the separate development institutions it was resolved that a symposium be held in Durban under the auspices of the UND-GRO where the public would be invited so that alternatives to political development should be put to the people. Leaders of all political opinions will be invited to share the platform.

It was also reported that the FED SAM STC has definte plans about this as part of its tenth anniversary celebrations next year.

Doth ventures were fully supported by the council.

It is hoped that we will be able to meet with students from the continent and establish links with our brothers in free Africa

#### 31/72:

Regional Sucretaries are expected to be regional literacy co-ordinators
and implement literacy schemes in the region but they are also regional

Arrangements are on to find offices in King William's Town and Cope Town. It is expected that staff will be appointed early next year.

The possibility of a Northern Cope regional office in Kimberley was raised, KINSO was casked to investigate the possibilities, costs and the extent to which KINSO would be able to meet the cost of the office.

- 6) Dryma groups should be formed and these should prount relevant material.
- Films that provoke student thought towards the Black struggle should be above.
- 6) It was felt that officials from the Organization should stay for +5 days on campuses. They should have time to meet students at group level and individually.
- 9) Inter-visits should be encouraged SASO Local Comm. members and/or S.R.C. members should be visits to other composes at times.
- 10) Infiltration of societies by relevent people should be encouraged. These people should involve themselves actively in the whole sphere of compus life.
- Labelling of people should be discouraged. The use of words like "con-white" should only be encouraged in cases where these is no fear of alignation.

## C) RELATION WITH ORGANISATIONS

- The Commission objected strongly to Res.42/72. It was recomm ended that members who are in SPHOCAS and SASO should give a clear talk and information on the relationship between SPHOCAS 6 SASO since the issue is presently confusing.

The Commission felt that Ros. 42/71 should be reviewed.

SPRICES 6 Other Organizations:— It was felt that contact and interes tion with bodies that hold idvolopics similar or related to ours should be maintained and premoted. The same should hold for all those bodies which are helpful, in whatever menner, to the Organization.

## SUB-COMMITTEE ON POLICY

The Sub-committee on Policy had to discuss the SASO policy for 1973 under the following terms of reference:

- 1) Education Black Students' Menifesto
- 2) Culture
- 3) A look at SASO Policy Mari?esto.
- 4) Constitution
- 5) Sport

## EDUCATION - BLACK STUDENTS\* MANUFESTO:

According to this term of reference the committee felt confined to the Students' manifesto. In this regard it endorded the preemble to the manifesto and tended to concentrate discussion on part C, the commitment part. While maintaining that the Black Students'Namifesto was all right and need not be then ged or have something added to it, the committee suggested that this document and its contents must be popularised; since there are students who in fact do not know of its existence.

"The asertion, manifestation and devalopment of awareness, socially......"
will be taken care of by the literacy project which is about to be planned and begun.

It was suggested as a means of promoting fraternity amongst students that the fresher orientation program to started by local city branches at home and that the mormal orientation wook at the begining of each year be an extention and intensification of something which started at home already.

CLITTE: This topic was not dissussed at all by the commission. In fact it was given over to the committee on Administration which was dealing with CULCOM, because it was felt that the whole sphere of culture was under CULCOM's care.

## SASO POLICY MANIFESTO:

Once more these was nothing to plan forward as regards the Policy Manifesto. What came out suite strongly was the desire to change the section in the Manifesto which say that S.A. is a country in which both blacks and White. live and shall continue to live together. It was contended that S.A. is the native country of blacks and; since Whites are foreigners S.A. must be seen in terms of its native inhabitants.

#### CONSTITUTION:

By the time this Committee sat, a discussion on the constitution had already been concluded and thus this point warranted no attention at that later stage.

## SPORT:

The Committee discussed sport on a national basis. It was suggested that contact be established with all national sport groups and SASO must be explained to this. More support should be given to those sport groups who have taken on against - the systum stance.

At the plenery session dismissed the sulture report of this committee as inadequete; whereupon certain terms of reference like Culture and sport were discussed by the plenery session. Not much really come on culture. Dut on sport a motion was passed; the easence of which shelt with SASO's attitude to international sport visa —vis S.A. and foreign countries vide NEC. RES. 20/72.

#### FINANCE

- 1) FUNDRAISING a) PROBEAT
  - b) STUDENTS' RELIEF FUND
- 2) DUDGET

It was reported that members of SASO have not undertaken any subtantial fund-raising on their own to keep the organization affoot and pay for all its financial obligations. As a result the Black community has not contributed much to support SASO and her programmes. This chapits several appeals to them and a well drawn out guide on Fund-raising propared to help students. It was then resolved that SASO should engage in large scale fund-raising in the Black community.

The two programmes carmarked for fund-reising are not so much for the administration of SASO or any overhead expenses but are meant to help students.

PRODEAT is the Promotion of Black Educational Advancement Trust Fund and has a target of R100,000 over 3/5 years to be raided within the country. Involved here is the Home Education Service, Student Loan Schome and the Student Voluntary Service.

It was suggested that this target could be mot if 150 Black professional and businessman were found who would each contribute A100 over three years. Students were to be asked to make contacts with prospective contributors and submit these to the Secretary, General who share follow-up on the matter.

Plens are also efoot to organise fundraising benquets in OURBAN JOHANNESDURG and CAPE TOWN each of which is expected to raise about 85000 - Guest speaker will be organged and tickets will be sold at 810 per couple.

ON CAMPLE: It was also full necessary that fund-raising should be undertaken on compus. With good management and publicity we are confident that students will contribute liberally to a good cause.

The BLACK STUDENTS' RELIGF FUND Will meet the incidental meets of students and will be administered by the SASD Executive. A separate Banking account and management by a Trust Committee will be hold for PROBEAT. They will allocate greats for projects, logar etc.

Students are not asked to find money for Administration and salaries since those are tied to the Budgets for Projects.

PUBLICITY/25

PRESENT: There is a need to explain to the students what the funds are required for end generally publicize scheaces like PRODEAT and its aims. Compuses may decide if they will reise funds for PRODEAT or the Students' Reslief Fund whichever they think they can contribute to ...
Jumble Sales, Talent Shows, Societize and Clubs will also be asked to contribute from their Rudgets towards the two projects film Shows, Art Exhibition Etc. Centree would be advised to tegin fund-reising early in the year. Some committed members could also be asked to pledge some amount e.g. 50c. per month towards the scheme.
