MINUTES OF THE SECOND NATIONAL ANNUAL CONGRESS OF THE ELACK
PROPLE'S CONVENTION HELD AT ST. PETER'S CONFERENCE CENTRE
FROM THE 15TH TO THE 17TH DECEMBER, 1973.

ISTH DECEMBER:

The acting vice-Fresident apologised to the house for the Congress starting late, the reason being that strict security measures had to be taken.

Delegates had to be given numerical status for security reasons. Persons with numerical styfus number 5 were regarded as observers and those with numerical status numbers 1,2,3and 4 were regarded as delegates and—fituratic delegates. Observers were not allowed in during officed secsions but, only delegates and alternate delegates.

Rev. N. Kayatula opened Congress by reading from the Sortjoures and the National Anthen "Rocel Sirclel Liffrika" was sung. Thereafter, Rev. Kayatula -a former interim President of 3.7.C. - said a few: encouraging words to the Congress. After commenting on Rev. Mayatula's opening reserts, the sorting vice-Tresident sade a obsek on the ordentials of delegates from the different Branches.

The acting vice-President informed the Congress of the President's absence and the National Executive Committee's decision was sought on this issue and the Congress demanded to be furnished with reasons. The delegates' credentials were again checked by the Chair and the minutes of the previous Congress were adopted.

Report of the National Executive Committee -by the Fublic Relations Off.

Foints from the Report;1.) Meetings were well attended save for the
last searcenor National Council.

The formation of the National Council was brought about by the N.E.C. to;

a)Ensure regular contact with and amongst Branches.

b) be less expensive than the Congressby meeting from time to time.

Other duties as performed by the National Executive Committee are contained in the N.B.C.'s report. After the feading of the Entional Executive Committe, the Chairman ruled that the Report be open for discussion.

MATTERS ARISING OUT OF THE M.E. C. REPORT.

1.) FIFA -a letter containing a Resolution and policy on sport taken in the provious Congress w.s sont calling for the ostracisation of South Africa from the International Sporting world. Subsequently a ban was imposed on South Africa. An attempt to lift the ban by the said body met with reprisal in the International Course. Another letter was addressed to International Clympics Committee(I.O.C.C.). The Secretary-General set with the FINAthe extensing body-representatives during their fact-finding mission on South Africa.

2. DORRIGH INVESTMENTS-

Letters were sunt to all lood foreign immesters calling upon them to withdraw from the South Afridan trading souter in the continued presence contributed to the minimismone of the Status Quo. Other investors had the more to reply justifying their presence—as they fall it was senant 'for improving the whole lot of Africane'. We still unnetseportally condem foreign investments—and this should be taken to be our stand and motion.

3.) FUND-RAISTNO-

The response from the Black doctors was not very good and it was felt that a comprohensive and detailed follow-up letter should be addressed to the doctors making them sware that they prospend from the Black Community and besides the Mcvement was also seant for their liberation. Other sources attempted in the Black Community showed indifference apathy for fear of violatisation. Another project seant for a house to house companies at with fithure as people immediately sessolited the Movement with the former outlawed political Oraminisations and the people fearer previate!

At this stage the President had already arrived and the Congress adjourned for breakfirst. The N.E.O. met and concessed the President about her absence and a righly was to be presented at the official opening scastime in the evening. Congress resumed with the following sotion under discussion:

The Report of the Mational Executive Committee was resumed and the following points were made known to the house.

4.) Relationship between N.A.W.L and N.E.F. - the National Executive made an attempt to bring the two bodies together by means of a joint meeting. Due to the incapositation of the people involved in the two Organizations, no follow-up could be made. Relationship between N.A.W.U. and N.P.C. was maintained and it was of a research nature with the exchange of material. An explanation was exught by the house on this issue -it was not forthcoming.

5 Black Bank commission

Nothing timefule had been done in this regard. The mandate in the line of investigating the possibility of establishing it had not been compiled with. The house then nandated the 'P-resident to look into the whole satter and also to take note of another Nicok Pank to be established by the system-created 'nattuition.

7. FINANCIAL REPORT
