Chief Buthelezi told the Inkatha conference that the United Democratic Front had `....risen to house the aspirations of those who seek to pursue their political self-importance at the cost of their brothers and even at the cost of the future of the country itself....'

He added: 'All my life I have pursued Black unity. I have always tried to be true to the demands of Black unity. These demands are not that we take some presty looking wallpaper to hide the cracks which threaten the house of liberation itself....



Inkatha rally, So-veto



The 10th annual conference of Inkatha was held recently in Ulundi, the capital of KwaZulu. It was attended by about 8,000 delegates and observers.

The President of Inkatha, Chief M G Buthelezi, Chief Minister of KwaZulu, announced that the membership of the movement had now reached 984,177 and it was expected that the millionth member would be enrolled within months.

The books of the movement were audited and open for inspection. The political reporter of the Rand Daily Mail had, in fact, spent some time inspecting Inkatha's records and had not refuted any of the claims made by the movement.

The Secretary-General of Inkatha, Dr O D Dhlomo (Minister of Eduction) stressed that, unlike other Black political movements in South Africa, Inkatha enjoys the support of individual 'paid up' members.

It now has 2013 branches throughout South Africa and is the biggest Black political movement in the history of the country.

The constitution of Inkatha does provide for affiliated membership and recently the National Sugar Refining and Allied Industries Employees' Union affiliated. It was the first of several formal Union moves expected this year.
