THE WRECKERS OF UNITY AT WORK.

It epens by asking the pertinent question: Who is the National Anti-C.A.D. Committee? The National Anti-C.A.D. Committee has of late taken decisions and issued statements that have shecked the affiliated erganisations. For some time new we have watched with anxiety the grewth of a tendency on the part of these at the head to behave as though they were responsible to nobedy but themselves It began to vielate the decisions of national conferences and, with the recklessness of people unused to the arduous task of building organisations, started to undo the werk of many years ... A statement issued by the National committee of the Anti-C.A.D. en the 5th May, 1959, reveals the utter irrespensibility of these who are running the affairs of this body. This statement contained a repudiation of an Executive Meeting of the Unity Mevement held on the 9th May as well as a public meeting (in Cape Tewn) on the 10th May under the auspices of the N.E.U.M......This shecking is the first announcement by the National Anti-C.A.D. Committee informing the affiliated erganisations that it has decided to break with the Unity Mevement and withdraw the Geleured sector from it. The circumstances reveal that it was not even the National anti-C.A.D. Comm. that is in control but a clique directed by the head of the Junta.... The question arises: Who has taken it woon himself the right to speak for the anti-C.A.D.? One thing that stands out clearly is that the two representatives (from the Anti-C.A.D. to the Unity Executive) received no mandate either from the National Anti-C.A.D., which they treated with utter contempt, er from the affiliated erganisations, to beyoutt the Unity meetings or to break on their behalf with the Unity Mevement."

TACTICS OF THE CLIQUE.

The article goes on to expose the tactics of the clique after the failure to subvert the All-African Convention and capture the leadership at the Edendale Conference. Conspiracy and vilification reached a climax in the issue of the pamphlet already mentioned: What is happening in the Non-European Unity Movement? "The aim of the document is to provide justification for the Breederbendtactics that have led up to the break with the Unity Mevement The method it adopts is to reiterate unsubstantiated charges in the hope that by dint of repetition these would be accepted as preven facts. Perhaps the most disquieting feature is the unadulterated racialism that drips from every paragraph...It accuses the leadership of the A.A.C. of all the crimes committed by the Junta against the Mevement - a very clever ruse of accusing others of the very crames they themselves are guilty of. It recalls to mind the classic story of a clover thiof, who, having Thief!Thief! pulled off a clover rebbery, was the first in getting himself appointed as searcher-in-chief. night advanced and all went merry as a marriage bell Jack found a way of making it generally known that he had some business to attend to. A few minutes Zater he emerged from the cleakroom shouting: Thief! Thief! and running towards the dark. There was general consternation. Considerable amounts in cash and precious jewels had disappeared. The mystery thickened when the guards surrounding the house reperted that no one had left the grounds and no strange person was to be fund found apywhere. Finally the guests agreed to a voluntary search. Mr. Jack was appointed searcher-in-chief; for who could have have suspected that the man who raised the alarm was the very thief they were looking for?"

SUPER LEADERS.

The self-styled 'foundationists' where ling at the Convention the accusation of reverting back to the "tribalist cult of the chief or leader," are busy building themselves into super leaders. According to this pamphlet, they conceived the idea of Unity ***Example** and built the Movement all on their own. The organisations whose names are down in the records as founders of the N.E.U.M. ***Example** would seem to be simply adjuncts to ***Example** four individuals (who sign the pamphlet.)

"All through they talk of THEIR programme, ***the THEIR Unity ***Evement**, THEIR struggle, THEIR conception of a nation. It's the old case of the gadfly that sat the whole day on the back of ***the a ploughing ex and when the day's work was done, flapped its wings and with a deep sigh exclaimed: 'What a let of work **we did to-day!',..... So steeped are these '** foundationists' in Herrenvolk attitudes that they regard the people in ***the Convention as some sort of appendage to them Their metto seems to be: 'Thou shalt have no other leaders but us.'"

Rabid Racialism.

The article particularly emphasises how racialism interpenetrates the whele pamphlet. "By far the werst aspect of the pamphlet is the relevation that the authors think in racialistic terms. Their whole approach is that of people steeped in the racialism of the Herrenvelk , their condescending attitude towards the African section, their arregance and superciliousness. Every mistake, real or imaginary. committed by an African must be due to tribalism, in the same way as a Herrenvelk racialist blames the caste system for the crimes of the Indians and shouts 'Ghette!' whenever a Jewish person is involved So steeped are our petit beurgeeis critics, our so-called 'foundationists,' in this mede of thinking that they do not even know that they themselves peddling Herrenvelk ideas. When the Nen-Whites demand equality, De Wet Nel is convinced that they are bluffing. What they want is superiority. When they get the vote, they will use their greater numbers to eppress the Whites. This belief is shared by all the Herrenvelk and the idea is used to unite the 'velk' and galvanise them into action whenever the Non-Whites make a move in the direction of freedom. But what does one say when a group of Non-Europeans uses the same idea to set one section of the oppressed against xx another? Are there words to describe the enormity of such to treachery? And yet this is precisely what the 'foundationists' have done in this pamphlet. "

THE FRAME-UP.

The article goes on to demonstrate how, in pretending that the Convention had left the Movement, the 'foundationists' utilized Mr. Tsotsi's presidential address, delivered at Edendale, 1958, mangled it out of all recognition and juggled with quotations so as to convey the very opposite of what was meant. On such questions as the land, as well as on nationalism, they had to resert to falsification, since they were determined to prove that he rejected the TEN-POINT PROGRAMME.

The entirely concludes by pointing out the effect of inx political crisic particularly on the interest in S.Africa. The liberals are trying desperately to re-establish contact with the particular leaders of the Non-Europeans and the petit-bourgeois is subjected to pressures that steadily undermine his meral fibre

The article sums up the significance of the attacks on the Unity Movement, pointing out how acutely the petit-bourgeois intellectual in particular feels the pressure of political crisis. "The revolt against the Unity Movement is an indication that the petit-bourgeois has reached the end of his tether and can no longer stand the strain. The shricking at the top of the voice as they withdraw....is both an announcement to their "friends' that they are no longer associated with the Unity

Mevement, and an attempt to draw away with them the whole of the Coloured sector of the Non-Europeans.It is therefore far too late new to attempt to withdraw the Coloured people from their place alongside their fellow-oppressed. In these last 16 years the Coloured people, like all other sections of the Non-Europeans, has have absorbed all too well the teachings of the N.E.U.M......The Non-Europeans know they are suffering from the same oppression; they have a common enemy and they have the same aspirations. It is upon this recognition, upon this base, that the N.E.U.M. is built. If individual leaders decide to desert it, they might hamper it a bit, delay its growth, but they cannot kill it. If the weak fall by the wayside, the best elements will step into their place. The Movement will grow with greater vigour precisely because it has survived an attack and has in the process developed those characteristics necessary for survival."
