7,62 mm MODEL 1941 SUB-MACHINE GUN PPSH-41
Model appears with 2 magazine types – 35 round boxed as shown and 71 round drum type.

7,62 mm RPD SQUAD LIGHT MACHINE GUN
(Automatic 100 round belt fed from drum)
Not yet found inside RSA.

7,62 mm RPK SQUAD LIGHT MACHINE GUN RUCHNOY PULEMET KOLASHNIKOV

The RPK is basically an AKM with a larger, sturdier barrel It has a bipod for stability.

7,62 mm DRAGUNOV SNIPERS SEMI-AUTOMATIC RIFLE

7,62 mm PKM GENERAL PURPOSE SQUAD LIGHT MACHINE GUN
(Belt fed 100,200 250 round)

7,62 mm GORYUNOV HEAVY MACHINE GUN SG-43
Belt fed 250 round
Can be vehicle mounted and used as an anti-aircraft weapon

This chart shows the heavier or more specialised weapons used by terrorist groups. Each group usually has one or a combination of the above weapons depending on size of group and its task. There are a number of small variations and model improvements of each weapon.
