STATEMENT OF THE AFRICAN NATIONAL CONGRESS OF SOUTH AFRICA ON THE OCCASSION OF THE 26th CONGRESS OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY OF THE SOVIET UNION-

Dear Comrades and Friends,

We the representatives of the African National Congress (SA), on behalf of our movement and the oppressed peoples of our country, wish in the first place to express our sincere thanks for the opportunity given us to be present in this great occassion of the 26th Congress of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union.

This is particularly a joyous moment for us, Comrades and Friends, because within a few months, our trusted ally, the South African Making been Communist Party will celebrate its 60th anniversary formed in 1921, only a few years after the formation of the our own national liberation movement, the African National Congress in 1912. There has always been a close fraternal relationship between the forces of national liberation and the proletariat Party, which bases its philosophy, organisation and methods of struggle on the teachings of the founders of international communism, Marx, Engels and Lenin.

We ourselves, being the oldest liberation movement in Africa, have much reason to welcome the enormous achievements and progress made by the workers, peasents and intellectuals of the Soviet Union under the inspired and dedicated leadership of your party. We recognise that our struggle for liberation and the struggles of the oppressed peoples of the former colonial world succeeded in throwing off the yoke of colonialism, imperialist exploitation and racism only by reason of the achievements of the Great October Socialist Revolution and inspited Leminist leadership of the

of the Bolshevik Party which from its inception and at all times correctly identified the struggles of the world proletariat and all progressive mankind with a determination of millions of peoples enslaved in the colonies to free themselves from racist domination and imperialist exploitation.

The revolution of IQI7 changed the balance of forces and the nature of the international community beyond recognition. For the first time inn history a government of workers, peasants and intellectuals came into being with the clear and expressed aim of abolishing exploitation of man, establishing working class rule, developing a planned economy, ensuring equality in all spheres, and eliminating the age-old curse of poverty, disease and ignorance. Within a few years of existence and inspite of a devastating civil war imposed by imperialist powers, the infant socialist state demonstrated beyond any doubt the superiority of scientific socialism over the anarchy and corruption of monopoly capitalism; the anarchy of unplanned markets and the violation of human rights on the alter of maximum profit.

In addition to the enormous task of creating a new type of social formation on the foundation of the outworn archaich autocracy, your party, dear Comrades and Friends, gave a helping arm to the downtrodden masses of the colonial world.

Already in November 1919, in an address to a Congress of Communist and Muslem representatives of the Far East, the great Lenin, a brilliant theorist and far-sighted strategist, stated that the proletariat off the advanced industrial countries will not be victorious without the aid of the toiling masses of all the oppressed colonial peoples in the first place ".That has been the guiding principle of your party since its formation in its relation

with the peoples of Africa, Asia and Latin America and whereever else imperialism established itselfeby violent bloodshed and treachevy. In the following year, in a report to the second Congress of the Socialist International, Lenin explained that it was the task of Communist Parties to support the national revolutionary movements, which are genuinly revolutionary. It was on the basis of these priciples that an alliance was formed between the Affican National Congress and the South African Communist Party; an alliance which the stood the test of visious repression, illegality and ruthless attempt to crush the opposition to the monstrous regime which people for the purpose of exploiting their lebour power with the active consent and assistance of the imperialist countries. of USA, western Europe and Japan.

It was undoubtedly the establishment of the socialist world order after the defeat of the fix Maxi fascist axis powers in the Great Patriotic War that hastened the era of decolonisation and brought political emancipation to hundreds of millions of peoples in the f former colonies. Comrades, this task of liberation will work not be completed until peoples have emancipated themselves also from the straight-jacket of capitalist exploitation. But that step too is being taken slowly and certainly with the aid of the Soviet Union and its allies.

Having in mind the great debt to the proletariat fatherland, we look within pride and joy at its mighty achievements in the fields of economic growth, social welfare, science, technology, literature and arts. A new civilization has been born as was recognised by Sidney and Beatrice Webb, authors of "The Soviet Union and the New Civilization" and leading members of British socialist movement. It is a civilization

civilisation characterised by the generation of enormous productive capacities, the employment of these forces with adequate regard for the preservation of natural environment, elimination of man-made inequalities between man and woman, between ethnic communities and nationalities. between town and country-side. It is this civilisation that embodies the hopes and dreams of progressive peoples throughout the ages. It is our privilege to be alive in this age of the new civilization to witness its progress and the take part in the glorious mission of building in our own country a social order that will open the way to the emergence of a new civilisation of our own making.

The guiding lines of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union's policy on the national question was laid down on the resolutions adopted in 1917 and again in 1921 wherein it was stated that the Fundamental Law will be enacted "nullifying all privileges enjoyed by all nations whatever, and all violations of the rights of the national minorities". Further more it was stated that the tasks of the Party was "to help the toiling masses of the Non-great Russian Peoples' to the representation of them; and for this purpose to develop an advanced industrial economy with a balanced agrarian policy. Comrades and Friends, I cannot forego the opprtunity for drawing a parallel between the backward border regions of tsarist Russia and the Bantustans imposed upon the African people of our country by them rapacious, racist, totalitarian regime of white South Africa.
