Please note that this is an entirely unofficial report, made by the writer without the authority of the two organizations, in order to keep friends overseas in touch at this difficult time. It needs to be read in conjunction with the first report I sent, dated September 10th.

1. BLACK COMMUNITY PROGRAMMES.

a) Durban.

Plans for the new Clinic are going shead, Ben Khoapa tella me,
Anglo-American have made a generous grant of R85,000, which will cover the
builting of the Clinic itself and of Staff quarters. This Clinic will be
built at the old Adaps Minsion site. The Revd.Ben Mgidi, a former
Chairman of the Congregational Church and at present on the Staff of the
Federal Theological Seminary, will become Matal Regional Director in
face. January, thus leaving Ben Khoapa entirely, for his work as Mational Excutive
Director, so the news from Durben is good!

b) Johannesburg.

I was wrong about Aubrey McKoena. He is dotained, like Steve Biko, under Section 5 of the Terrorian Act. This means no visitors, and possibly severe 'interrogation'. I have no news of Aubrey, save that he is detained in the Fort, the old and grin prison in the centre of Johannesburg, where nore than a dozen women are also detained under the Internal Security Act. Ar Winston Mondo, whom I have not net, but who was working for BCP before his detection, has recently been released after 520 days in detention. I have visited Dr.Notlana, a Director of E.C.F., in detention at Nodder Bee Prison, Benomi.

c) Umtata. I have no recent information.

d) Kingwilliamstown

The administration remains in the capable hands of him Hoble Lonspi, ably assisted by Miss Mosipho - (I apploguise for having lost the note I made of Mosipho's surmane: this is one of the disadvantages of knowing everyone by his or her first name!) A well produced "Black Yleupoint" publication on "Transket Independence" has just appeared: I am enclosing as many copies as I can persuade my courier to take for distribution to our friends.

Zamesmilo Clinic continues to run smoothly. Dr.Falveni will be leaving at the end of the year, but there is hope, first, for the release of Dr.Ramphels and Dr.Zolombela at the end of the year, or, failing that, for new help to replace him. I think Dr.Palweni is going to the new Clinic in Natal.

I was down in King at the beginning of this south, so these notes are based on personal observation. I was able to see Dr. Hamphela Ramphele in detention, also Hr Halusi Hpumluana. Both these dear friends were looking well and are in excellent spirite, and they assured me of the good bealth and spirits of our other triends in detention. The treatment in King Prison is reasonable. The man play football, etc. Heuspapers, books and food can be brought in. They are not kept in isolation. They can receive two visits per week of half an hour each. All this is written without in any way wishing to mitigate condemnation of the senseless brutality and waste of detaining these people, some of the best young citizens of South Africa. Miss Thoko Khanjwa is now held with our other friends in Kingmillianntown Prison under the Internal Security Act.

Steve Bike remains in detention under Section 6 (Terrorism Act). His wife has seen him twice the last time was November 15th. She tells me he is very thin. A doctor sees him once a week.

ZHELE TRUST FUND.

Mrs Momalico Zakavu, the hard-working and conscientious Secretary of the Trust, continues to work unaided, but in constant co-operation with Mrs Mohapi. We are exercised about the legal position of the Fund, particularly in the light of recent threats made to the Secretary by members of the Security Branch. We are investigating the position, but we are hampered by the fact that the Security Branch still has most of the Trust's documents which were removed shortly after the detention of the Iste Nr Mohapi. Until more clarity is reached over this it would be wisest for our friends to channel funds for Zinele through the Durban-based firm of attorneys, Mr Exençe, 5th floor, Danjee Centre, 158 Victoria Street, Durban 4001, whose Trust account number is 0705695 at Standard Bank, Commercial Road, Durban 4001.

The first project, a brick-making scheme at Dimbane, has began. This engages eight ex-political prisoners, who have been comployed by the Trust at R90 per month for six months. They have a Dateun truck, bought by the late Kr Hohapi for the Trust before his detention, and a concrete-mixer. They are still awaiting a brick-making machine. Other tools are available. Uhile I was in King we heard that they had sold 300 bricks at 25cents each, and that more orders had come in than they could cope with.

The second project, a soft-goods selling project at Edantsane, is not doing so well, principally because of the lack of a male field worker to give it some kind of remote supervision.

Dut mainly, at this time of depletion of staff through detentions, the work of relief (including help in educational fees) is the biggest work of the Trust this extends to Durban (through Nr Selby Beque, Trustee) and Cape Town (through Revd.Tansanqa Holetsane, Trustee): and a contribution is also being made to the relief work of the Black Parents' Association in Johannesburg, to express solidarity with them.

Hiss Tenjiue Mtintso, whose detention was mentioned in the first report, was moved from East London to Untata (Transkei) last month, before independence - for what reason remains obscure. He'nother (helped by Dependent's Conforence of SACC and by Zimele) was able to fly down from Johannesburg last week with Tenjiwe's boy Lumumbe, and, after much initial difficulty, was able to see her. She reports that Tenjiwe is very thin, but otherwise reasonably well: but her conditions of confinement are on the whole as rigorous as under Section 6 of the Terrorius act in the Republic of South Africa, except that her warders are black and not white, and therefore tend to be more human, and will at least converse with her in her own fanguage. Her Pumsile Hahlakata, the Field Yorker for Zimele, is now held under the Internal Security Act, and so is with our other friends in Kingvillianstown Prison.
