Dear Friend

The David Webster Trust has been represented by legal counsel throughout the Harms Commission in an effort to bring to light the identity of the assassins of David Webster and to expose the circumstances surrounding his murder.

Although we have been unsuccessful in achieving our main goal, nevertheless interesting and, we believe, pertinent information surfaced through the evidence given to the commission. Also, we believe that inferences may be drawn from the evidence withheld from the commission by the Civil Co-operation Bureau (CCB).

In association with the Human Rights Commission, we have produced the enclosed booklet in which you may be interested because of your pledge towards the reward for information leading to the apprehension of the assassins. The booklet summarises the proceedings of the Harms Commission regarding the CCB and puts forward our argument to the Commission. It discusses the origins of the CCB, the context in which it operates, its manner of operation and suggestions for its effective disbanding. We do not consider that the announcement on 31 July by General Geldenhuys that the CCB has been disbanded is a satisfactory conclusion to the organisation and we will try to take our protest further.
